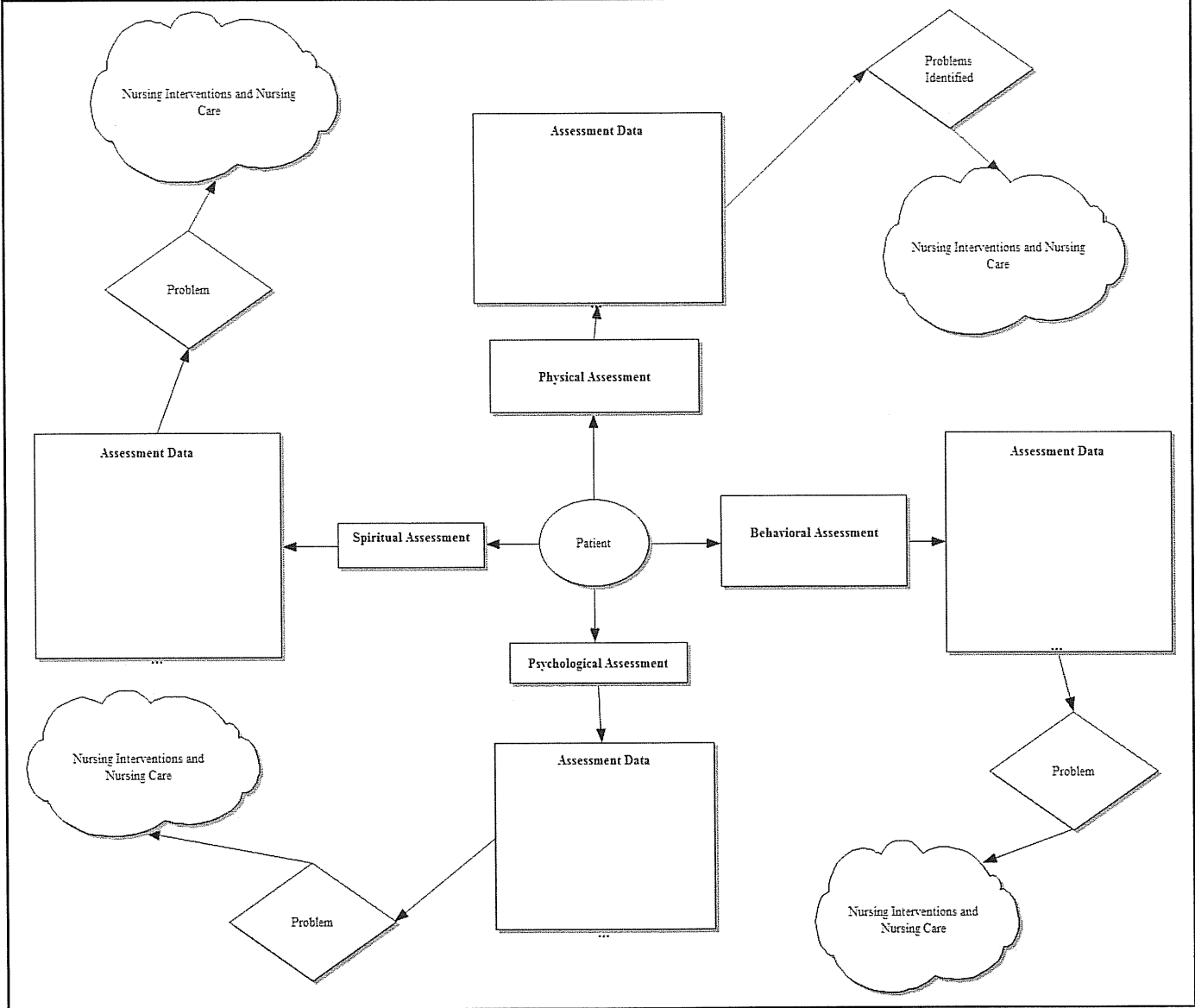


Course Student Learning Outcome #1, Competencies:
