Dr. Brian Ellison

Vice President of Instruction Department: Office of Instruction Years with College: 12 years and 9 months: 1998 to 2000 and 2016 to present

Dr. Ellison is in charge of fiscal and strategic planning responsibility for the instructional programs comprising Merced College. He has administrative oversight of the credit, noncredit, community education, and contract education programs including all CTE programs, social and behavioral sciences, English and the humanities, the natural sciences, mathematics, business and computer science, foreign languages, the fine arts, music, physical education, allied health, and child development. He provides oversight for the Library and Learning Resources Center, Child Development Center, Office of Institutional Effectiveness, and the college farm. He administers the curriculum development process and oversees liaison activity between the college and State Chancellor's Office. He provides oversight of those operational budgets under the control of the Office of Instruction. He serves as the ACCJC Accreditation Liaison Officer and as a member of the District Negotiating Team. He fulfills the role of Acting Superintendent-President and Chief Executive Officer in the absence of the Superintendent-President/CEO

Dr. Ellison is in charge of administering several grants, including: A dult Education Block Grant, Carl Perkins Grant, CTE Transitions Grant, CCPT Career Pathways Trust Grant (Agriculture), CCPT Career Pathway in Logistics, CTE Enhanced Fund, Cal SOAP Grant, SB 1070 Grant, Enrollment Growth and Retention/Attrition Reduction for Associate degree Nursing, Assessment, Remediation and Retention for Associate Degree RN Programs, and the Basic Skills and Student Transformation Grant.

Dr. Ellison has a Doctor of Education: *Educational Leadership* from the University of La Verne (2002). His dissertation topic was <u>Identification of Factors Enhancing or Impeding the Utilization of Instructional</u> <u>Television (An analysis of resistance to organizational change within selected K-6 schools in Merced County)</u>.

He has a Master of Arts: *Applied Sociology* from San Diego State University (1987). His thesis was <u>Work</u> <u>Roles and Safety Orientations: A Functionalist Approach</u> (An analysis of San Diego Gas & Electric employee attitudes toward Occupational Safety and Health regulations).

He has Bachelor of Arts: *Psychology and Sociology* from San Diego State University (1985). He completed a double major with academic distinction in both disciplines.

He has an Associate of Arts: General Psychology from San Diego Mesa College (1983).

Dr. Ellison grew up in University City which near La Jolla, San Diego and has surfed for over 44 years. He shapes his own boards under the label *S&S Surfboards* in reference to his two daughters Sierra and Savannah.
