What is a DOI?

Some library databases, such as PsycINFO, list a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) for individual articles. A DOI is a unique identifying number for an article. In the database record for an article, you will see an element that looks like this, which you should include at the end of your APA reference:

Many articles will NOT contain a DOI. Search the Web to find the address of the homepage of the journal that published the article and include it in your citation. Please be aware, however, that the full text of articles may not actually be available at the journal homepage. If you cannot find the journal homepage, cite the database you are using, such as "www.esbscohost.com."
