





Fall Enrollments: Fall 2011 – Fall 2017 (Unique Headcount)





#### Credit FTES: Fall 2011 - Fall 2017






## Student Demographics, Fall 2017





**Ethnicity** 




### Faculty & Staff Demographics, Fall 2017





# Degrees Earned, 2014/15 - 2016/17


