Class Refund Policy

Community Education realizes that extenuating circumstances do arise. However, Community Education does not receive any state or federal funding in order to operate. We are a fee-supported entity of the college. Your enrollment fees pay for the cost of the program and the office support. In many cases, we are unable to recoup the costs incurred if you drop a class after the class has started. In regard to this, we have established the following policies:

- All College for Kids class registrations are final, and no refunds will be awarded unless a class is canceled by Merced College.
- Community Education reserves the right to cancel any class. Full refunds are automatically granted if a class is canceled by our office.
- College for Kids reserves the right to change a student's schedule if he/she has been enrolled in a class that is not consistent with the student's appropriate age/grade level.
- If you need to cancel an enrollment, please contact our office as soon as possible prior to the start date.
- For all College for Kids registration cancellations, a refund will be issued as an electronic voucher on your account and will be held until July 27, 2023. If at that time, you have not used the voucher, you can request a refund via email.
 - Cash payments will be refunded by check and will arrive via mail. Credit card payments will be refunded as a credit back to the same card that was used. Refunds take approximately 4-6 weeks to process.
- Extenuating circumstances will be considered on a case-by-case basis by staff and the Dean.

Occasionally there may be adjustments to the schedule for a class due to college facilities usage. We will notify participants of any of these changes as quickly as possible. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

What is College for Kids?

We provide safe activities for summer fun and learning. We have classes and camps to accommodate most ages.

Our classes are designed to stimulate curiosity, reinforce basic skills, help kids discover new subjects, and, most of all, help your child make lasting memories!

Where will the classes be held?

Most College for Kids classes will be held on the main college campus. The exception would be the Golf Camp, which will be held in Atwater at Rancho Del Rey Golf Club.

What are the age ranges to register for classes?

Enrichment classes are available to students going into 2nd grade thru 8th grade. Ages for aquatics programs and sports camps vary. Exact ages/grade levels can be found in class descriptions throughout the brochure.

What does registration cover?

The registration covers all class/camp enrollment fees and supplies unless otherwise specified. It does not cover the cost of snacks, meals, or other related expenses.

What if my child becomes sick?

If your child has a temperature or is complaining of an upset stomach, earache, severe cold, undetermined rash, or other symptoms of illness, he/she will be escorted to our office and you will be contacted to pick up your child.

What time and where can I drop my child off and pick him/her up?

There is no designated drop-off or pick-up time or area. Parent/guardian must arrange a drop-off and pick-up location with their child. You may drop off up to 15 minutes prior and must pick up no later than 15 minutes after their last class of the day.

Please be on time to pick up your child. Should there be any changes to your child's schedule, or any absences, please call Community Education staff at (209) 384-6224. Office staff will make a note on the instructor roster.

Will my child be escorted to and from class?

Our new policy for CFK 2023 will be that all students will be escorted between classes. The exception will be aquatics students. **Parents will** be responsible for dropping off and picking up their child(ren) from the pool.

May I attend class with my child?

We ask that you do not go into the classroom while class is in session so the instructor and students are not disrupted. Our instructors and staff have passed clearance to work with children to ensure their safety. Many classes have either projects to take home or presentations that will be given on the last day. Parents will be invited to attend presentations.

Will parking passes be available?

Parking passes will be available for parents/guardians of all students. You will be given a parking pass once a Youth Participant Waiver is turned in to the Community Education staff.

Parent and Me (Ages 2 & Under)

Practice water safety skills & participate in fun water activities designed to encourage little ones to explore the water. A parent or guardian is required to be in the water with their child. All children in this level are required to wear swim diapers.

Tiny Tots (Ages 3 - 5)

Students will be introduced to submerging their mouth, nose, and eyes. They will be taught breath control and floating. Jumping in unassisted and holding onto the wall themselves will also be taught.

Advanced Tiny Tots (Ages 4 - 6)

Students will practice floating, rolling over, kicking and arm movement on the wall. Students must be able to attend without a parent present in the water and be able to demonstrate all skills required to pass Tiny Tots.

Beginners I (Ages 4 - 7)

This class will introduce students to the front and back crawl & rhythmic breathing. The practice of assisted diving, retrieving objects from the bottom of the shallow end, gliding, and elementary backstroke will be shown. Students must be able to demonstrate all skills required to pass Tiny Tots.

Beginners II (Ages 8 & Up)

This class focuses on the improvement of front & back crawl and rhythmic breathing. Students will practice assisted diving, retrieving objects from the bottom of the shallow end, glides, & elementary backstroke.

Advanced Beginners (1 hour)

Students will develop confidence & improve on the front & back crawl. They will practice dolphin kicks, breaststroke, open turns, deep water bobs, treading water, & diving unassisted. Must be able to swim 25 yards/1 lap unassisted.

Intermediate (1 hour)

Students will practice breaststroke, backstroke, & sidestroke. Flip turns, pike & surface dives, & diving from the board are all introduced. Students must demonstrate all skills required to pass Advanced Beginners. Must be able to swim 1 lap unassisted.

Diving (1 hour)

Dive from the side in a stride position. Dive from the board with a walking approach and hurdle. Vertical to horizontal positioning. Must be able to tread water and demonstrate a forward dive and back dive in a tuck or pike position.
