




#### Fall Enrollments: Fall 2009 - Fall 2015 (Unique Headcount)




### <u> Credit FTES: Fall 2009 - Fall 2015</u>




#### Non-Credit FTES: Fall 2009 - Fall 2015







Beginning in fall 2012, a cohort of all certificate-, degree-, and transfer-seeking first-time, full-time students were tracked over a three-year period. 


