




Fall Enrollments: Fall 2013 - Fall 2019



Credit FTES: Fall 2013 - Fall 2019





Non-Credit FTES: Fall 2013 - Fall 2019



Student Demographics, Fall 2019












Transfer Rates, 2012—2018
