## ADDENDUM 1

This addendum contains clarification and additional information, which modifies the conditions of the above referenced BID/RFP as follows:

These figures do not include students who are enrolled at college classes at the high school or are enrolled in inmate education (since those students are not likely to come to campus during the school year).
