

Moving from the county fairgrounds to a permanent campus site in a mere four years is only one aspect in the establishment and growth of Merced College since it opened its doors to serve the needs of the college community.

The number of students enrolled has grown --- tremendously.

The faculty and classified staff has grown.

The curriculum has expanded.

And so has Merced College grown in its reputation as a servant to the educational needs of the community.

With voter approval on February 27, 1962, the junior college district was established and the directions were formulated for opening the college doors, at the fairgrounds, in the fall of 1963.

The first year, the college offered courses for freshmen, and additional courses were offered the following year to round out the two-year program.

Merced College had a full-time complement of 16 teaching faculty members the first fall, with some thirty part-time instructors, primarily involved in the evening program. Today, the college has a full-time staff of over fifty instructors.

Upon opening, the college anticipated a day enrollment of about 300 and an evening enrollment of as many as a thousand. Today, total enrollment numbers over 2,600 full-time and part-time students.

Students attend from the communities of Atwater, Chowchilla, Le Grand, Livingston, Los Banos, Mariposa, Merced, and Planada, as well as a substantial number of enrollees from Castle Air Force Base.

The INFERNO staff has been a witness to only a few of the pace-setting events that have helped to establish Merced College. But it has been fortunate to be a part of the move to the permanent campus, an event that every student and every staff member can be proud of.

President's Message

The move to the permanent campus has brought a renewed surge of enthusiasm for Merced College and its future. 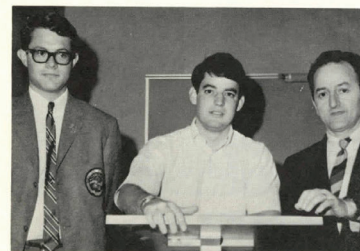

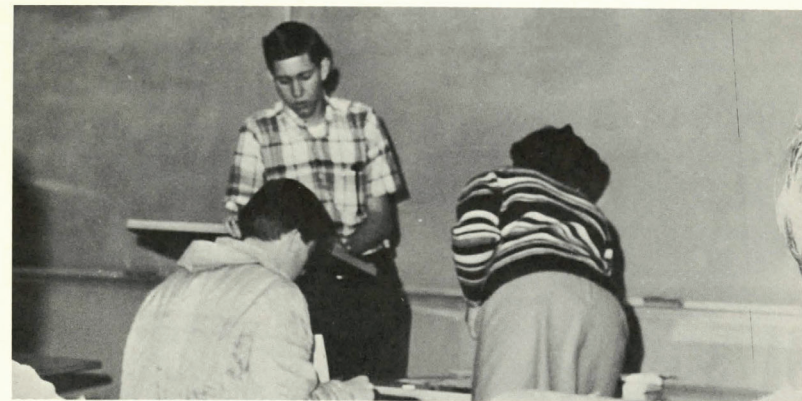

Where will we finish next year? It's impossible to say. One thing is certain, however: The Blue Devils will once again be in pursuit of the Championship, from the first to the last game.

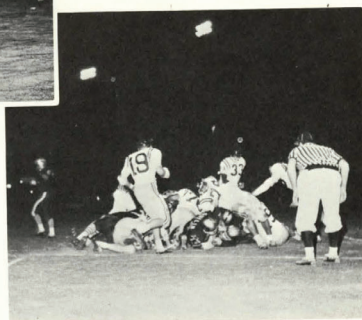
